The prospect is that the War Loan will be largely over-subscribed, in fact, instead of \$150,000,000, the subscriptions may reach a quarter billion.

The government has expropriated the Ross factory and some day will make the Lee-Enfield rifles. The war may be over, however, before the factory can be put in operation as a government enterprise.

Canada's third domestic war loan has proved another great success. When the returns are all in it is expected that the subscriptions will exceed the sum asked by a clear hundred million dollars.

The Regina Province, a conservative paper, has announced its party independence. It is in favor of free trade in wheat, free trade in machinery, aid to milling and packing houses, and federal prohibition in support of provincial prohibition.

THE WEEK IN THE LEGISLATURE.

Toronto, March 24.—Race track gambling, particularly during the war, came in for a great battering from Liberal members in the Legislature. It was Lambert Wigle, member for South Essex, who brought the matter before the House. He objected particularly to the establishment last year of two more race tracks in the vicinity of Windsor, which makes a total of three in that city alone, operating 42 days in the year.

Sam Carter, M.P.P. for South Wellington, thought that race track gambling in Ontario was an outrageous scandal. Men sitting in high places were making fortunes through their connection with race tracks. Mr. McGarry declared that the government could not keep these tracks out and that all they had done was to license them to obtain a revenue.

WHAT'S AN "ATRIUM"?

Ordinary every-day citizens of Ontario in their own homes call it a "front hall," but in Government House, which the people of Ontario are paying for with their own money during war time, it is called the "atrium," and the marble alone in the "atrium" cost the province \$20,000, and the total expense in this part of the building will run well over \$30,000.

This is one of the latest sensational details brought to light in the Public Accounts Committee. Another point brought out is that the government sent its architect to New York to visit homes of some of the great millionaires of the United States to get suggestions for furnishing Government House. In addition, the former Minister of Public Works, Dr. Reaume, went to Europe to visit the elaborate chateaux of that continent, also to get suggestions for furnishing Ontario's Government House.

As one of the members of the committee pointed out, not only should Ontario not ape the extravagance of American millionaires, but there is also this difference that the New Yorkers at least paid for their own houses, whereas this palace is being built with the money of the people of Ontario, not 1/10 of whom ever visit the place.

BIG SALARY INCREASES: Governmental economy, especially during the war, is being urged vigorously by the Liberals in the Legislature. Not only are they condemning in the warmest kind of way the extravagant expenditures on Government House, but they are also dealing with other aspects of the question.

C. M. Bowman, Chief Liberal Whip, led a debate in the House deprecating the unnecessary multiplication of government officials during the past two years, whereby there are practically two

officials in the Inside Service to-day for every one in the year 1904. Mr. Bowman also contended that owing to the prevailing war conditions, the time was inopportune for the general increase being made by the government in the salaries of those employed in the public service, especially of those already in receipt of substantial salaries of \$2,000 per year and upwards.

The government voted down his resolution that the cost of civil government should not be further increased at this time except where essential to ensure its efficiency, and that no permanent increases in salaries of \$2,000 and upwards should be made at this time.

Mr. Dewar, during the debate, referred particularly to the case of the Deputy Registrar General, who is receiving an increase of \$800 or 50% of his present salary. This official, Mr. Dewar said, was the brother-in-law of the Assistant Provincial Secretary, and from another brother-in-law of the same officer in Sarnia, the drugs for government institutions all over the province had been purchased.

Sir Adam Beck made a slashing attack against Mackenzie & Mann and other big railway interests and claimed that water power had been stolen from the people. Mr. Rowell said that the people of Canada hadn't received the transportation facilities they were entitled to, and believed they would not be satisfied with the consolidation of the railways under private ownership. The whole system of lines would have to be operated for the benefit of the public.

Sam Carter's motion for adequate treatment by the government of the urgent and serious problem of the feeble-minded in Ontario was rejected as in past years. "It makes your blood boil," said Alan Studholme, Independent Labor member of East Hamilton, "when you see how this problem is being allowed to drift by the government."

WAR LOAN WAS A SUCCESS.

Subscriptions May Reach the Quarter Billion Mark.

OTTAWA, March 26.—Canada's third domestic war loan was considerably over-subscribed even without the applications of the chartered banks of the country for sixty million dollars of the bonds or of persons seeking to convert ten-year securities, floated in 1911, or 5 per cent. debenture stock maturing in 1919, into the new twenty-year issue. It is predicted that the subscriptions for the new loan may be found to have reached \$250,000,000, including those of the banks, and excluding those to be paid by conversion of the earlier war issues.

An official statement issued Sunday says: "While the subscription lists of Canada's third war loan closed on Friday, the 23rd of March, several days must yet elapse before the mails from distant points carrying thousands of subscriptions are received. Sufficient applications, however, have come to hand to warrant the Minister of Finance in stating that the loan is an unqualified success. When all the subscriptions have been received it will be found that the loan has been considerably over-subscribed without taking into account the subscriptions of the chartered banks or conversions into this loan of bonds or stock of any other issue. Indeed, the Minister would not be surprised if the total subscriptions, including those of the banks and excluding conversions, would aggregate \$250,000,000."

All three domestic loans floated in Canada have been over-subscribed. In 1914, when fifty millions were required, applications for one hundred were received. In 1916, when \$100,000,000 of bonds were offered, subscriptions for more than double that amount were received. It is said that in the present case only the original authorized total of \$150,000,000 will be issued, that the subscriptions of the banks will probably not be accepted, and that the funds in their hands will thus be left available for carrying on the ordinary business of the country.

Germany Bullies Holland.

LONDON, March 26.—A Berlin telegram transmitted by Reuter's Amsterdam correspondent maintains that the Dutch Government was guilty of an unneutral act in permitting the armed British steamer Princess Melita to leave Dutch waters after her recent visit to them. The despatch declares the steamer ought to have been interned. Referring to the Dutch action, the despatch continues: "This is the more galling to Germany because about the same time the Dutch gave a narrow interpretation of neutrality in the case of two German submarines. Holland's difficult position is appreciated in Germany, but Germany must demand that in a matter so important in naval warfare as the utilization of Dutch waters by warships she shall not be placed at a disadvantage in a completely unjustifiable way."

Sheltered Discharged Soldiers.

LONDON, March 26.—Monsignor Louis Legraive, vicar-general to Cardinal Mercier, Primate of Belgium, has been sentenced to three months' imprisonment and deported to Germany for sheltering a discharged French soldier for one night, according to a Central News despatch from Amsterdam. This information is confirmed by a Reuter despatch from Amsterdam, which adds that Canon Allard, spiritual director of the great seminary of Malines, of which Monsignor Legraive was president, has been sentenced to eight months' imprisonment in Germany for giving shelter to another discharged French soldier.
