first rule; he shall also attend to the male prisoners' day wards, and see that they are kept clean and in good order, and that the prisoners keep themselves quiet and orderly; he will cause them to change their shirts or clothing for washing; he will also give any assistance required in the duties of the Gaol generally.

IV.

It shall be the duty of the Fourth Turnkey, assisted by the Sixth Turnkey, to attend to the male prisoners when at work; he will see that the yard is kept clean and in proper order; he will also give assistance, when required, in the duties of the Gael generally.

v,

It shall be the duty of the Fifth Turnkey to keep the books and records of the Gaol, and to act as clerk generally; to attend to the sleeping cells and prisoners in solitary confinement. He will also give any assistance required in the duties of the Gaol generally.

vı.

It shall be the duty of the Sixth Turnkey to assist the Fourth Turnkey, as specified in the fourth rule; he will also see that all male prisoners who are brought into Gaol are properly bathed and cleaned, and their clothes taken proper care of; he will also give any assistance required in the duties of the Gaol generally.

VII.

It shall be the duty of all the Turnkeys except the First (when not otherwise engaged) each evening, after the buckets are carried in, to closely examine the yard, to see that all the prisoners have returned to their respective wards, and that none are allowed to remain outside. They shall report the result to the Governor or in his absence to the First Turnkey.
