manent set. There are four of them, one on each side above and them, one on each side

of age all of the temporary teeth should be in their places in the mouth.
When the first molars come they cause an immense amount of pressure. From the pain and reflex irritation of the nerves, children often exhibit serious symptoms
such as violently inflamed mouth and throat, spasms of an epileptic type, dizziness, vomiting, headaches, insomnia and diarrhea.
These wide reflexes are not surprising when you know that the Fifth nerve, which supplies the teeth and mouth, gives sensory
branches to nine of the twelve branches to nine of the twelve
cranial nerves. This means that an irritation in or about the mouth can affect the nerve sup ply of a large part of the body. When these big molars finally

apparatus are a few of the penal ties that follow the loss of the first molars in childhood.
Unfortunately these teeth are found-decayed more frequently than areany other teeth in the mouth. From the sixth to the twelfth year children should be
