Grenville, sister of the late Robert Bell, Esq., C.E., who represented Russell in the Can. Assem. previous to Confederation. First returned to Parlt, at g. e., 1874. Unseated, on petition, 10 Nov., 1874; re-elected 16 Dec., same year; re-elected at g. e., 1878, 1882, 1887 and 1891. A Liberal Conservative.—*Kemptville, Ont.*

FERGUSON, JOHN. (*South Renfrew.*)

Second s. of the late Archibald Ferguson and Margaret Barr, natives of Argyleshire, Scot. B. at Granart, Argyleshire, 17 April, 1840. Came to Can. with his parents in 1847, and settled in Admaston where he has since been engaged in farming and lumbering. First returned to Parlt 2 Aug., 1887, to fill vacancy created by the death of the sitting mem. Mr. Campbell. Re-elected at last g. e. An Independent Conservative, approving of the policy of Sir John A. Macdonald's Government.—*Admaston, Ont.*

FLINT, THOMAS BARNARD. (*Yarmouth.*)

S. of John Flint, whose ancestors came from New England and were among the earliest settlers—about 1761—of the western portion of N.S. B. in Yarmouth, 28 April, 1847.
