Assem. at g. e., 1863. Sat in the Commons from g. e. 1867, until g. e. 1872, when defeated. Sat in Leg. Assem., Ont., from g. e. 1871, until 1872, when he resigned in consequence of the passing of the Act abolishing Dual representation. Re-elected to the Commons at g. e. 1874; unseated on petition, 12 May, 1875. Re-elected 22 June, 1875, and sat until the dissolution of that Parlt. in 1887. Called to the Senate 4 Feb., 1887. A Liberal Conservative.—*Stromness, Ont.*

MCCLELAN, *Hon.* ABNER REID.

Descended from an Irish family which came from Londonderry to N. B. in the latter part of the last century. Youngest s. of the late Peter McClelan, Esq., J. P. B. at Hopewell, N. B., 4 Jan., 1831. Ed. there and at Mount Allison Academy. M. Annie J., dau. of W. J. Reid, Esq., Collector of Customs, Port Harvey. Is a retired merchant. Was one of the Governors of Mount Allison Wesleyan Coll., Sackville, N. B., and Vice-Presdt. of the Alumni Soc. of the Academy and Coll. of that name. Has been for a number of years Commr. of the Civil Court and Auditor of the Municipality of Albert. Was a mem. of the Government of N.B. as Chief Commr. of Public Works, from April, 1866, until the Union. Sat for Albert in N. B. Assem., from 1854 until the Union. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867. A Liberal.—*Riverside, Hopewell, N. B.*

MCDONALD, *Hon.* WILLIAM, J. P.

Descended from a Scottish family. Grandfather emigrated from the Island of Uist, Scot., and settled in the Co. Inverness, N.S. B. at River Dennis Road, Inverness, N. S., 7 Oct., 1837. Ed. there and at St. Francois Xavier Coll., Antigonish. M. Feb., 1865, Kate, dau. of Mr. Donald McDonald, of East Bay, C.B. A merchant. Has been postmaster of Little Glace Bay, which position he resigned previous to g. e. 1872. Sat for Cape Breton in the Commons from g. e. 1872, until called to the Senate, 12 May, 1884. A Liberal Conservative, and in favour of protecting the native industries of the country from unequal foreign competition.—*Little Glace Bay, N. S.*
