Resolution reported from Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills:—That in any Petition for the incorporation of Private Companies, which would be incorporated under the Joint Stock Companies Act, 1869, there shall be set forth the particular reasons, why a special Act of incorporation is required; and also if it is proposed to exempt the Company from the operation of any of the clauses of the said Act, the promoters of the said Bill shall lay before the Committee before it passes on the Clauses, the reasons why they desire such exemption, and that the substance of this Rule be 'published by the Clerk, in conformity with the terms of Rule 50, 250.
