VI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Register who shall be so appointed, before he enters upon the execution of his Office, in either of the said Districts, shall also enter into, and make and execute a Bond unto His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, with two good and sufficient sureties, before one or more of the Judges of the Court of King's Bench for the District in which he is appointed to act, in the following sums, that is to say: Such Register in the sum of £500, and each surety in the sum of £250. With condition for the true and faithful performance of the duty of such Register in the execution of his said Office, in all things directed or required by this Act, and such Bond so made and executed shall remain deposited of record in the Records of the Court of King's Bench of the District in which such Register is appointed to act.

VII. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that when, within the space of one year, from and after the death, removal or resignation of such Register, no mis-behaviour shall appear to have been committed by such Register in the execution of his office, then in such case and from thenceforth, such Bond so made and executed by the sureties of such Register, shall as to such sureties, be void and of no effect to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

VIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Register shall give due attendance in the Office of the Prothonotary of the Court of King's Bench, of and for the District in which he shall be appointed to act, each and every day throughout the year, (Sundays and Holidays excepted,) from the hour of nine in the morning to the hour of twelve at noon, and from the hour of two to the hour of four in the afternoon, for the despatch of the business of his Office; And every such Register as often as required, shall make search concerning all Actes which have been or might have been enrolled (insinué) in his office, and give Certificates of enrolment or non-enrolment under his signature, if thereunto required by any person or persons, and copies certified under his signature of all Actes enrollcd (insinué) in his office, if copies shall in like manner be required by any person or persons.

IX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every Register, at the time at which the Copy or Expedition of any *Acte* shall to him be tendered to be enrolled according to the directions of this Act, shall endorse on such Copy or Expedition, the number thereof, according to the numerical order in which such Copy or Expedition, and others shall have been received to be enrolled by him and his predecessors in office, and such Copy
