The Bears outshot the Ookpiks 37-31. Ken Hodge, Bears' goalie, did not play one of his better games. The Ookpiks goals found their way into the Bears' net between Hodge's legs on a number of occasions. Tookey's goal floated casually past Hodge. Jeff Lastiwka, Ookpiks' goalie, played well. He faced 20 shots in the second period alone.


