

Ottawa, 28th Sept., 1910.

Dear Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of 26th instant, stating that the Indians of Suiker Creek propose sending a delegation to Ottawa for the purpose of laying before the Department the question of fishing and hunting; and in reply to inform you that it is not considered advisable that the delegation should come to Ottawa at present as the Deputy Minister is now ill and likely to be for some time. It would be better if the Indians would consult the Agent of the Department - Mr. C. L. D. Sims, of Manitowaning - and make any representations to him that they consider necessary in regard to the question of fishing and hunting. Mr. Sims is being communicated with in the matter.
