Sir,-

I am in receipt of your letter of the 10th instant, in regard to the case of Mrs. Luce Robichaud, an Abenakis woman from Beauport, who is about to take up her residence at Pierreville, I beg to say that this woman is also known as Luce Metzala-banlette. She has been in receipt of relief supplies to the value of \$7.00 a month. As the woman is of advanced age the Department desires that you will endeavor to make arrangements for her to live with an Indian family at Pierreville, provided she will be satisfied with such an arrangement. Heretofore she has lived alone, but it is thought she cannot any longer care for herself. The Department is prepared to continue to afford her assistance to the value of \$7.00 a month. You should endeavour to make the best arrangement possible under the circumstances.
