She has been in receipt of relief supplies to the value of \$7.00 a month. As the woman is of advanced age the Department desires that you will endeavor to make arrangements for her to live with an Indian family at Pierreville, provided she will be estimied with such an arrangement. Heretofore the has lived alone, but it is thought she cannot any longer care for hersalf. The Department is prepared to continue to afford her assistance to the value of \$7.00 a month .. You should endeavour to make the best arrangement possible under the circumstances.
