Dear Doctor Grant -

I have your letter of the 31st ultimo, in reference to Mr. Hendry's request to be furnished with seed grain for their farm. This is most unusual, and I think Mr. Hendry should be able to finance the seeding operations, as you are no doubt aware the Department has furnished all the farming equipment for the school.

With regard to the last paragraph of your letter, from my previous experience I quite appreciate the difficulty there is in making an arrangement mutually satisfactory to all concerned. This is not a matter that calls for action by Parliament anymore than the provision of funds, and no change would be made this year. Between now and the
