- I. The west half of the north half of Lot 3, Range 3, containing 50 acres.
- 2. The south & of the North & of Lot 4, Range 3, containing 50 acres.
- 3. The South 2 of the North 2 of the South 2 Lot 4 Range 3 containing 25 acres.
- 4. The west i of the North i of Lot 4, Range 4, containing 50 acres.
- 5. The East i of the wouth i of Lot 3 Range 4, containing 50 acres.
- 6. The east 1 of the south 1 of Lot 5 Range 4, containing 50 acres.
- 7. The East & of Lot 6, Range 4. containing ICO acros.
- 5. All of block C.in Range 7 lying East of the Creek containing 55 acres.
- The North part of Lot I, Range 7, bounded on the south by a line drawn from the spoint where the line between Lots 24 and 25 Range I in the village of Colbourne produced Northerly strikes the Northerly limit of the Road allowance along the Northerly limit of the said Mange I, thence North-easterly sixteen chains more or less to a point in the East limit of the said Lot I Range 7, distant 2.60 chains from the Northerly angle thereof.
