Ottawa, May 17,1913. Sir, In reply to your letter of the 10th instant, I have to request you to inform the Indians on your next visit to Enderby that in 1892 the right of way of the Shaswap and Okanagan Railway through the Enderby Indian Reserve No. 2 of the Spellamcheen Band and through Reserve No. 3 of the Okanagan Band were duly paid for by the said Railway Company. Through the Enderby Indian Reserve 23.26 scres were taken valued at \$25.00 per acre:\$581.25 and through the other reserve 6.08 acres at \$35.00 per acre = \$212.50. The said sums were then duly pleced to the gredit of the respective bands. The Spellemoheen band has now to the credit of its capital account \$822.03 and to its interest account \$268.83. The Okanagan Band to the credit of its capital account \$641.52 and to its interest account \$201.11. Your obedient servant, Assistant Deputy and Secretary. T. J.
