

STANBRIDGE STATION.

A village in the township of Stanbridge, County of Missisquoi, on the C. V. R. and Junction with St. Lawrence & Champlain Junction branch of the C. P. R. Has grown up entirely since advent of railways. It is a shipping point for hay and grain. It has one English and one French school, two hotels, one carriage and butter factory, four stores, post and telegraph office, two mails daily east, south and north. There is a stage line between here and Stanbridge East and Dunham, and between the station Pike River and Henryville. Population 250. Distance from Pike River, two miles; Bedford, two miles; St. Armand Station, 10 miles. There is a Commercial Agency of the United States at this station.

ST. ARMAND.

A village in the parish of St. Armand West, County of Missisquoi. It has a Roman Catholic church, R. C. and Protestant schools, two hotels, post, telegraph and express offices, one store, one tinsmith shop, one blacksmith shop, and one shoe shop. It is situated on the main line of the C. V. R. R. between Montreal and St. Albans, is a point of entry and warehousing port. A daily stage runs from here to Frelighsburg via Pigeon Hill and St. Armand Centre, also to Philipsburg three times daily, mails to and from Montreal twice daily, to St. Albans one daily. Distance from Stanbridge Station, 10 miles; Philipsburg, 2 miles; Frelighsburg, 10 miles; Highgate, Springs, Vt., 5 miles; St. Albans, 17 miles; Montreal, 52 miles; St. Johns, 25 miles. First station in Canada; was formerly known as Moore's Corners and as such will be remembered in connection with the troubles of '37 and '38, and later in connection with the Fenian raids of '66 and '70.
