R. between Montreal and St. Albans, is a port of entry and warehousing port. Distance from Stanbridge Station, 10 miles; Philipsburg, 2 miles: Frelighsburg, 10 miles; Highgate, Springs, Vt., 5 miles; St. Albans, 17 miles; Montreal, 52 miles; St. Johns, 25 miles. First station in Canada; was formerly known as Moore's Corners and as such will be remembered in connection with the troubles of '37 and '38, and later in connection with the Fenian raids of '66 and '70.
