A post village in the Township of East Zorra, situated on the 11th and 12th Concessions, Lot 18 (gravel road,) seven miles from Woodstock, and seven from Tavistock. It was laid out by Andrew Kennedy, in the year 1853, and now contains two stores, one blacksmith shop, one shoe shop, one hotel, one physician, one church and a good school, with an average attendance of about 60 pupils. The post-office was established in 1865—John Lappin, postmaster. Population about 100.
