# HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

Any oven numbered section of Reminien Lands in Manitoba rth-West Turritories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not bes suded, or reserved to p-wylde wood lots for sottiens, or 8 suppose, may be homestcaded upon by any porson who is the 8 a finally, or any male over 18 years of ags, to the extent larter section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Butry must be made personally at the local land effec for the district in which the land is situate.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES,

A settler who has been cranted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Deminion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mottier, if the father is deceased) of the home-steader resides upon a farm in the ricinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residence with the father or mother.

43: If a settler was entitied to and has obtained entry for a secon homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain parent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

the second nomestead is in the vicinity of the first nomestead, (4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township. A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (6) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlers only who completed the duties upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Com-missioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitobs or the North-West Territories incrematics as to the lands that are open for entry, which is not to the lands that are open for entry, the second is not to the territories, free of expense, advice and assistance insecuring and to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British Columbia, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoba, or to any of the Dominion Land Agents in anitobs or the North-West Territories.
