Coarse bread is much better for children car, or the bark of the squarrel is heard, or the almost to devot on, in all who are acquainted. You still valk on admiring the lovely plumage and listening to the sweet notes of the warblers finny tribes frisking and sporting on its sparkling waters. A walk in another direction brings you to what is called the Hill; that is the most beautiful part of the place. Here you enter a broad and elegant street lined with private residences, in front of some of which is a spacious lawn, in the centre of which is a fountain with its gravel walks, shaded with trees of the most magnificent foliage, interspersed with rose trees, and other flowering plants. Flowers are as common in the United States as thistles, nettles, and chickweed, in Newfoundland. But amid all this rich luxuriance of nature lurks disease and death. Diarrhea, dysentery, small pox, typhoid, typhus, and other fevers prevail in almost every place I have visited. More die of consumption in this country than of any other disease. This I think is brought on by their habits and manner of living, which would take me too long to explain .--The cholera morbus still lingers in some of the Western and Southern States. One case has lately appeared at Boston.

Last night (July 5th.) was the most awful and terrific night I ever witnessed.
