for that Purpose, till the next Sessions of the General-Affembly.

- "That Provision be made in the said Act, that every Farmer shall receive the Duty or have Credit for so much as is confumed in his District, and no more.
- "That the Duties be put up at a higher Price than the Sum paid into the Treasury last Year, which will effectually prevent their being lessened by farming;
- " And that an Enacting Clause be inserted in the Act, that the faid Act shall be the Rule for recovering His Majesty's Duties and no other.

The Council fent down a Bill, intitled An Act in further Addition to an Act, intitled An Act for regulating Petit Juries, and declaring the Qualification of furors, with a Message, that they desire the Concurrence of this House to the same.

And the faid Bill was read,

Ordered, That it be read a 2d Time.

And then the House adjourned till To-morrow Morning 10 o'Clock
