The remaining Resolutions, being read a second time; and the Question being put, that this House doth concur with the Committee in the said Resolutions; the House divided; and it was resolved in the Affirmative.

Mr. Street reported, from the Committee of Supply, several Resolutions, which were read, as follow :-

1. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twelve thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the expenses for Tug service between Montreal and Kingston; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Seventy-five thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the expenses for the Provincial Steamers; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

3. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Forty-five thousand five hundred and thirty-

six dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for the Trinity House, Quebec; for the financial

year ending 30th June, 1867.

4. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-seven thousand seven hundred and nineteen dollars be granted to Her Majesty, viz.: - For the Trinity House of Montreal, the sum of Twenty-five thousand seven hundred and seventy dollars; and for arrears from 1865-66, the sum of One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine dollars; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

5. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Forty thousand dollars, be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the expenses for Inland Lake and River Lights; for the financial year

- ending 30th June, 1867.
  6. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Four hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, viz.: - For allowance to Pierre Broche, for residing at Lake Matapediac, on the Kempt Road, to assist travellers thereon, the sum of One hundred dollars; to Marcel Broche, at Petit Lac, for the same purpose, the sum of One hundred dollars; to Jonathan Noble, at La Fourche, for the same purpose, the sum of One hundred dollars; and to T. Evans, at Assametquagan, for the same purpose, the sum of One hundred dollars; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.
- 7. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Two thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for proportion of expenses of maintenance of Light Houses on the Islands of St. Paul and Scatterie; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

8. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, towards the construction of a Light House on the East point of Prince

Edward Island; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

9. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Seventy-five thousand dellars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the Salaries and Contingent Expenses of the Supervisor of Cullers' Offices at Quebec and Montreal; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

Ordered, That the said Resolutions be now read a second time. And the First Resolution, being read a second time, was agreed to.

The Second Resolution, being read a second time; and the Question being put, That this House doth concur with the Committee in the said Resolution; the House divided:— And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The remaining Resolutions, being read a second time, were agreed to.

Mr. Morris reported, from the Committee of Supply, several Resolutions, which were read, as follow :~

1. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Twenty-five thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the expenses of Fisheries in Upper and Lower Canada, including

Bounties; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

2. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Ten thousand five hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty; to defray expenses for Railway Inspection, the sum of Four thousand dollars, and to defray expenses for Steamboat Inspection, the sum of Six thousand five hundred dollars; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.

3. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding One thousand one hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray expenses for supplying blankets to aged and destitute Indians, of Upper and Lower Canada; for the financial year ending 30th June, 1867.
