subjects has been dealt with in the last few Sessions that I shall hope to congratulate you on your release at a time somewhat earlier than usual.

With this hope I now leave you to your Parliamentary labors.

His Excellency the Governor General was pleased to retire, and the Legislative Assembly withdrew.
