Senator Moves That All Postal Employes Speak Both French and English. [By Special Wire to The Courier]

OTTAWA, Ont., May 20.- On third reading in the Senate of a bill relating to wages of lower grades of post office employees, Senator Choquette moved in amendment that no person should be employed in the post office department, in either Ontario or Quebec, unless he or she spoke "both official languages," English and French.

Hon. Mr Lougheed said that as was a money bill, it could not be amended, and was supported in this by Senator Power.

Senator Belcourt disagreed and said that it was no more out of order to require employees to speak both languages than it would be to compel them to write a legible hand.

The third reading amondment and point of order were held over on Senator Choquette's suggestion. He announced that when opportunity arose he would move that employees of all departments in Quebec, Ontario and New Brunswick be required to converse in both languages.

**ROCKEFELLER**, JR., **COMES FROM COVER** 

He Had Been Driven Into Retreat by Colorado Strike Sympathizers.

NEW YORK, May 20.-John D. Rockefeller, Jr., has returned to work after twenty days spent at the country estate of his father at Pocantico Hills. Since May 1, when he went into retirement, most of his tormenters, under the leadership of Upton Sinclair, have been silenced, several by being sent to jail. Sinclair is in Colorado and Marie Canz and Rev. Bouck White are serving sentences on Blackwell's Island, the latter for having broken up the services at the Calvary Baptist Church ten days ago. "Mother" Jones alone remains in the lecture field, and nightly denounces the Rockefeller interests in the Colorado coal districts.

Mr. Rockefeller's secretary said yesterday that he was making no investigation of conditions in Colorado. He was only a minority stockhlder in the Colorado Fuel and Iron Company, it was said, and whatever re commendations he could offer might not influence the officials of the company in dealing with the miners.
