COPPER SALE TO BRITAIN ENORMOUS

Boston, Dec. 24.—The Boston News Bureau says that about 200,000,000 pounds of copper was sold yesterday, more than in any previous 24 hours in the world's history. Its gross value exceeds \$40,000,000, as the price was 20 cents per pound or better. The British Government bought 134,400,000 pounds in one block of the Anaconda Company. This metal will be apportioned among producers, mainly to clients of the American Smelting and Refining Company. The market has now been swept bare of spot copper.
