BORDEN ISSUES MESSAGE

By Courier Special Wire. Ottawa, Dec. 18.—Sir Robert Borden issued a statement to-day expressing his satisfaction with the result of the general election and thanking both Conservatives and Liberals for their efforts in behalf of the Union Government. It is as follows: "The people of Canada have fully realized and splendidly fulfilled their duty. The Union Government will have a majority of at least fifty in the new Parliament. The result of the soldiers' vote is not yet known, but it may increase the majority of the Union Government to sixty or more. In any case, if party lines are to be taken into account it is a triumph as much for the Liberals as for the Conservatives. The splendid elements of the Liberal party who worked so strenuously and with such magnificent results in every province, except one, are to be congratulated equally with the Conservatives. Especially are to be congratulated the members of the Conservative party who, regardless of party affiliations, supported and elected the Liberal candidates in many districts. "It was a notable feat of democracy. The Canadian people after more than three years of heroic devotion and untold self-sacrifice, were called upon to say whether Canada's effort in the war should be continued. In the midst of the campaign the test of compulsory military training to every citizen had returned to the front, after glorious and heroic service to their country in France and in Flanders, are especially entitled to Canada's grateful thanks for their equally notable service in the campaign just concluded. The vivid recollection of the overmastering issue; their splendid loyalty; their comrades still in the trenches; their complete disregard of all minor considerations, enabled them to exercise a strong influence upon public opinion, both here and at the front. "The same is true of the womanhood of Canada. Their devotion and self-sacrifice have been outstanding throughout the war and were never more conspicuous than during the past six weeks. Unworthy appeals were contemptuously rejected, and the higher considerations alone inspired their actions, which contributed notably to the result. "And, indeed, throughout the country, leaders of public opinion were responsive to the greatness of the appeal. The clergy, the teachers in the universities and in the public schools, men in every walk of life who on ordinary occasions took no active part in party struggles, were constrained by the country's needs and by the stern call of duty to throw themselves into a contest which concerned the national duty and the national honor. "Canada's battle line is held three thousand miles away, and by men who went gladly, and bravely, to fight and perhaps to die, in order that peace might reign within our borders. Many of them have been in the trenches for more than two years; they look for aid and support to the country which sent them forth under the pledge of its honor. Some of them will spend their fourth Christmas beyond the seas. Canada now sends them the assurance of which they have longed, and it will bring joy and comfort to every heart among them. "But that message will bring relief not only to the Canadian army corps, but to the Mother Country and to every dominion of the British Commonwealth. To them and to all the allied nations it proclaims Canada's invincible and unflinching determination to maintain her efforts and to take her part until the wild beast of German militarism shall have been subdued and such victory accomplished as will bring assured peace to war-devastated world. DEFEAT IS THE LOT OF TWO FORMER WELL KNOWN BRANTFORDITES

Hardy in Brockville and Richardson in Kingston Both Candidates Ran For Laurier. Brockville, Dec. 18.—Sir Thomas White, Canada's finance minister, was returned for the riding of Leedon with a great majority over Arthur C. Hardy, Laurierite. The result was never in doubt, as from the outset of the campaign public opinion turned strongly toward Union Government.

A contributing factor in the victory was the stirring efforts of the non-partisan women's organization, which took its full share in manning the polling booths with scrutineers and worked unselfishly, getting out the feminine vote from 6 o'clock in the morning till closing time in the afternoon. The ladies were also conspicuous in the Liberal interests, as far as outside work was concerned. The weather was clear and intensely cold, but the ladies bravely wore their heavy vote was cast through the riding. The women scored heavily in their support of the Finance Minister, the majority marking their ballots for Union Government. In the village, usually pretty evenly divided politically, by 325, and, judging by returns from the various rural municipalities which go to make up the constituency, he will have between 1,200 and 1,500.

Richardson, Also. Kingston, Dec. 18.—Kingston elected W. F. Nickle, N.C., Unionist candidate, by a majority of 2,777, the largest ever given in an election here. The vote stood: W. F. Nickle, 4,498; Dr. A. W. Richardson, Laurier Liberal, 1,721. When the soldier vote is counted, Nickle's majority will likely run up to 3,500. Both newspapers supported Nickle, and he had a perfect organization. Women were very prominent in yesterday's contest, and despite the extreme cold weather, women of over eighty-five years of age cast their ballots. Dr. Richardson entered an official protest against the reported results at Queen's University, and the Army and Navy Veterans' quarters at the last minute.
