Assuming that each car needs three new tires a year, a conservative estimate, there is a yearly replacement demand of 1,200.

The number of new cars manufactured and purchased will approximate 100,000 cars, which creates a further demand for another 500,000 tires.

The minimum requirement for Canada n 1921 is, therefore, 1,700,000 new tires.


