GENERAL NEWS.

—New York legislators are still

quarrelling over the Worlds Fair

question.

—During the past year 24,134

stray dogs were captured in the streets

of London by the police.

—The London Times has settled

the libel suit brought against it by

Mr. Parnell for £5,000.

—The government reduction works

at Vancouver, B. C. were burned on

the 5th inst., causing a loss of \$25,

000.

—An explosion occurred in a Mon-

mouthshire, England, colliery on the

6th inst., by which 150 men were killed.

—It is reported that King Milan is

a victim of melancholy. His gambling

debts trouble him and he threatens

suicide.

—There are only three newspapers

printed in China, and exchange edi-

tors have pretty nearly as soft a job

as the printer.

—A collision on the Michigan

Central R. R. near St. Thomas Ont.

resulted in the death of the engineer.

Several train men were injured.

—It is said that the finances of the

French government are in a very

slim condition and the expenditures

for some years will have to be light.

—The French chamber of Com-

merce of Montreal will shortly pe-

tition for a penny postage by car-

riage for the whole empire.

—Fine warships for the Turkish

navy were launched recently, one be-

ing a corvette, three gunboats and

one a torpedo boat.

—The statement is made that

more than 65,000 elephants are killed

in Africa, every year, and that

price of ivory in a raw state is worth

\$4,000,000.

—A skull has been found in Rome,

in a tomb of the fourth century be-

fore Christ, the lower jaw of which

contains a case of gold with four false

teeth in it.

—Chin Tom, a Chinese
