Encoenia Week at U. N. B. Opens With the Baccalaureate Sermon

Academic Year at the University Closing With Customary Proceedings, the First of Which Was the Preaching of the Baccalaureate Sermon at Christchurch Cathedral on Sunday by Rev. C. A. Kuhring, of St. John--Many Soldier Graduates and Former Students Expected to be Present.

This is Encoenia week at the University of New Brunswick and the customary ceremonies which mark the close of each academic year are taking place. Despite the fact that the attendance during the week period, it is believed that the proceedings this year will prove an attraction, and particularly to many graduates and former students who have been serving overseas.

The first event in connection with the Encoenia took place on Sunday morning, when Rev. C. A. Kuhring, of St. John's (Stone Church), St. John, preached the baccalaureate sermon at Christchurch Cathedral.

The Encoenia exercises will take place Thursday afternoon, beginning at 2 o'clock. The programme for the Thursday morning at 10 o'clock, the Senate of the university will meet in annual session at the educational office.

Forceful Sermon Preached at Christchurch Cathedral on Sunday

Rev. Mr. Kuhring took as his text the 13th verse of the third chapter of St. Paul's Epistle to the Philippians, viz: "That I may apprehend that for which I am apprehended of God."

It is always a solemn yet glad moment when young men and young women are about to step forward into a new and unknown experience of their life.

Your university experience is a great asset, gift and endowment. And, in the days to come when you take your place as leaders of men and women, resist ingratitude, remember your Alma Mater and the professors who inspired you and gave you the gifts and talents and have honored their Alma Mater.

principles remain the same, because God is truth and truth is of God; the applications of these principles change because of the human element. The whole world, nationally and individually, is in a state of flux, ready to be poured into such moulds as we supply. Everywhere unrest, upheaval, things are being shaken. This is what makes it more difficult, but it is a glorious opportunity to the man or woman of courage.

Things, conditions, will soon harden again, but meantime you are given the high honor of helping to mould and fashion the present world that it may be a better place for generations yet unborn. For you there is the possibility of being numbered amongst those great heroes who have opened new paths in the desolate and solitary places. Things are not what they were. The present conditions are best expressed in the words of Hebraeus: "God, whose voice once shook the earth; now He hath pronounced, saying, 'yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven; this signifieth the removing of things that are shaken that those things which cannot be shaken may remain."

The Great War's Results. In the great War through which we have passed, both the spiritual and physical realms have been shaken that we may build anew. You are privileged to be present at the reconstruction of the things that remain. All selfish desires and tasks remain. God calls you to come and help Him to reconstruct the world for man.

Only a few years ago, if a man saw his duty to his Dominion he was reckoned a great patriot. Later, the standard of greatness became higher and demanded an interest and action as wide as Empire ere he could be counted a statesman. Today, if a man would really be great, he must see a close brotherhood, in church and state, of all those who are allied in the war of righteousness against evil.

Not left to lie like a fallen tree: Not dead but living unto Thee. They serve the King of whom John writes: "He had on His vestments, and on His thigh a name written, King of kings and Lord of lords. And the armies which were in Heaven followed Him upon white horses, clothed in the linen, white and clean."

May the Vision never fade; may the Voice calling you to do and to dare never be disobeyed; and may courage be given you to go to the end of life serving not self but God, thus making many rich and at last when you stand "face to face" with Him who is the subject and ideal of all the arts - with Him who planted and sustains the forests, and with Him who weighs the hills as in a balance, may it be that each one shall near for himself or herself the gracious welcome: "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of Thy Lord."
