

## IMPORTERS' ASSOCIATION

THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1911-1912 WERE ADOPTED BY THE ASSOCIATION AT A MEETING HELD ON APRIL 26th, 1911.

- 1st.—Dry Goods and Hardware Stores to close at 6 p.m. from the present date until May 5th; Saturdays at 9.30 p.m.
- 2nd.—To close at 9 p.m. from Monday, May 8th, until June 2nd; Saturdays at 9.30 p.m.
- 3rd.—To close at 6 p.m. from Monday, June 5th, until October 6th; Saturdays at 9.30 p.m.
- 4th.—To close at 9 p.m. from Monday, October 9th, until December 30th; Saturdays at 9.30 p.m., except from December 18th to 23rd (Christmas Week), when the stores will close at 10 p.m.
- 5th.—To close at 6 p.m. from Tuesday, January 2nd, 1912, until the date of the annual meeting in April; Saturdays at 9 p.m.
- 6th.—Half-Holidays—Wednesday, the 14th and 28th June; 5th, 19th and 26th July; 9th, 16th and 30th of August, Sept. 6th; stores to close at 12.30 p.m.
- 7th.—Holidays—June 22nd and 23rd (to celebrate Coronation Day and the King's Birthday); Wednesday, July 12th; August 23rd; Sept. 13th, Labour Day and Regatta Day.
- 8th.—Half-Holidays—Wednesday, January 31; 7th, 14th, and 28th February; 6th, 13th, and 27th March; stores to close at 12.30 p.m.
- 9th.—Holidays—Wednesday, January 24th; February 21st and March 17th.
- 10th.—Any week during the season in which there may be a general holiday other than Wednesday, the regular holiday or half holiday will not be observed.

X. B.—The attention of the Public is called to the above Regulations, and purchasers are respectfully asked to co-operate by making purchases before time named for closing stores.

To avoid delay and annoyance to persons visiting the city on business, their attention is directed particularly to the arrangement for closing the stores on WEDNESDAYS instead of THURSDAYS, as on previous years.
