### TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

#### OBLIGED TO RETURN.

BELFAST, Dec. 3.  
Three members of a Sinn Fein Peace Delegation, bound for Dublin from England, were turned back on their voyage to-day, when the steamer Cambria on which they were travelling, collided with a schooner soon after leaving Holyhead, England. The schooner, with a crew of three, was crewed by the Cambria returned to Holyhead. The Irish delegates on board were Michael Collins, George Gavan Duffy and Erskine Childers.

#### HENDERSON ATTACKS ULSTER.

LONDON, Dec. 3.  
Ulster's uncompromising attitude in the present negotiations for peace in Ireland was warmly attacked last night by Arthur Henderson, Secretary of the Labor Party and late member of the War Cabinet. Sinn Fein had made concessions, Henderson said, but Ulster refused to move an inch, taking shelter under Lloyd George's pledge that he would not coerce Ulster. If Ulster entertains the wild dream that the British people will allow Sinn Fein to be dragged because Ulster wants settlement on her own terms they are deluding themselves. Labor will oppose any such weakness.

#### ADVOCATES CO-OPERATION.

HALIFAX, Dec. 3.  
"Stories of widespread destitution in Newfoundland have been greatly exaggerated," said Mr. A. B. Morine in an address before the Commercial Club of Halifax. He said there was readjustment common to all the world, but acute in Newfoundland. Newfoundland, he said, was not unlike Canada, had too many railways. They had bitten off more than they could chew. Speaking of the fish trade Mr. Morine said there should be co-operation between those having fish to sell and exporters. He had been called the great high priest of Confederation, he said, but he was no longer such. From now on he would be anti-Confederation. Every political party in Newfoundland always charged that the other party was in favor of Confederation, but there was no champion of this cause left in Newfoundland to-day.

#### GREAT BRITAIN SATISFIED.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 3.  
(By Ben Descon, Canadian Press Staff Correspondent)—Great Britain is likely to find herself the one nation that will be completely satisfied by the results of the present Conference. That is, because her objects in entering the Conference were so simple and clear. This statement was made to a group of Canadian newspapermen by a representative of the British delegation to the Washington Conference, who occupies a high position in the British official party. The British objects in entering the Conference, he said, were "first to aid in the prevention of a possible conflict between Japan and the United States," second, "determination to cement Anglo-American friendship." The objects were so simple that some of the representatives of other nations appeared to find it very difficult to understand the British attitude, he said.

#### WOULD CAUSE COMPLICATIONS.

BERLIN, Dec. 3.  
Berlin financiers express the opinion that the Moratorium or long-term loan would be beset with numerous complications for Germany, and would not prove to be the complete blessing that has been suggested. In the event that Germany was granted a three years moratorium, experts predict that she would have to provide France with international credit to enable her to keep up to French budget, which is based on present reparations terms.

#### Scalers Leaving.

A party of thirty men, comprising experienced scalers and their assistants, leave by to-morrow's express for the North where pulp wood is being cut for the Government. Twenty three of these men are returned soldiers. The scalers must, of necessity, be experienced men, but this does not apply to their assistants. The scaling list is now completed and it is useless for any to apply for a job in this connection.

#### Horse Racing Preparations.

A meeting of the Horsemen's Association will likely be held in a few days, when arrangements in connection with the winter Derby will be considered. It is proposed that the event takes place in the early part of the season, and that there should be several race days. There are a number of fast horses, which will be seen for the first time and the races should prove interesting. The race for the \$50 Victory Bond offered by Mr. H. Macpherson for the fastest 2 1/2 year old after Howard Mann, will come off this season.
