DUBLIN, May 5.—When Dail Eireann met to-day a motion was received from the Free State Committee saying it might be able to meet on Saturday. Dail thereupon adjourned until Wednesday. Meanwhile truce between the rival factions which was to expire Monday has been extended until Wednesday.

### TURKS ANGRY WITH ITALY.

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 5.—The Turkish Nationalist Government forbids Italian ships entrance into the Turkish Black Sea ports. The nationalists say Italy connived with Turkey to dispose of Turkish territory without consulting Ankara.
