TO-DAY'S MESSAGES

POPULAR DEMAND.

ATHENS, Oct. 27.
The demand of the people to try for-
mer Premier, now under arrest by
court martial, instead of allowing the
next National Assembly to arrange a
form of trial, confronts the revolu-
tionary committee and the existing
cabinet with a grave problem as it is
feared that execution of the former
Ministers would inaugurate an era of
vengeance, bloodshed and revolution.

ALL MUST REGISTER.

SMYRNA, Oct. 27.
Turkish Nationalist authorities have
announced that all foreigners desir-
ing to remain in Anatolia must regis-
ter immediately with the local au-
thorities. Applicants must agree to
submit to Turkish law in every re-
spect, waiving all right to appeal to
the protection of their own govern-
ment.

DE VALERA'S NEW MOVE.

DUBLIN, Oct. 27.
Valera has just made a new move,
summoning a second Dail, which con-
stituted itself a Republican Govern-
ment, and nominated a Council of
State. Valera always contended that
Second Dail never formally dissolved,
refusing to recognize the Provisional
Parliament as replacing it, especially
challenging Parliament's capacity to
interfere with political funds in the
United States.

KILKENNY CATS.

ROME, Oct. 27.
Communists and Fascists have been
burning one another's dairies near the
boundaries between the provinces of
Milan and Pavia. The Fascists not
only burned the Communist dairies,
but banished all Communists in the
area, also the Socialist leader Deputy
Bellotti.

ENGLISH POLITICS.

LONDON, Oct. 27.
The latest development in the
Electoral Campaign is an understand-
ing reported to have been reached in
some districts, under which Conser-
vatives have agreed not to oppose
Coalition Liberal candidates under
Lloyd George's banner, who will
pledge themselves to give general
support to Winston Churchill, sec-
retary for the colonies in the Lloyd
George ministry, and J. A. M. Mac-
Donald, also Coalition Liberal. The
Times referring to these deals says
Coalition Liberal party is in danger
of breaking in two, due to lack of de-
cisive lead by Lloyd George.

Geese Gave Clues to Gold Fields.

The account published recently of
a Syrian goose, in the glizard of
which were found flakes of pure gold,
calls to mind a similar case which
occurred some years ago in British
Columbia.

A wild goose shot at Pitt Lake was
brought into New Westminster by the
sportsman who had killed it, and when
cleaned no less than 70 shillings' worth
of coarse gold was found in its
gizzard.

Prospectors started immediately for
Pitt Lake, but, although alluvial gold
was found, the quantity was not suf-
ficient to enable anyone to make a for-
tune.

There are several other cases on
record of gold being found in the bod-
ies of birds. A duck killed on the
farm of a man named Prebyl, who
owned land near Omaha, in the state
of Nebraska, was found to have sev-
eral tiny nuggets of pure gold in its
crop. These came from a stream
running through the farm, but here
— as at Pitt Lake — the quantity of the
precious metal was too small to make
mining worth while.

Such finds do not always end in
wild-goose chases. In 1913 a boy, the
son of a Mr. McKellar, of New South
Wales, was out trapping rabbits. He
had a terrier with him, and the dog,
scratching at a hole, exposed a mass
of rock which the boy, who had been
brought up in gold-bearing country,
recognized at once as gold ore. He
hurried home with his news, and his
father lost no time in pegging out a
claim. The ore proved very rich, the
first parcel of 50 tons yielding three
ounces of gold to the ton.—Tit-Bits.

Things Worth Knowing.

To clean a kettle, fill with potato
peelings, add water, and boil fast un-
til clean.

If a bottled milk pudding "catches"
when cooking, the burnt taste can be
removed by putting the pan at once
into cold water, and adding a pinch
of salt to the milk.

Gilt frames can be cleaned by ap-
plying a little linseed oil with a brush.
They must not be touched with damp
sponges or leathers.

Ink-stains can be removed from a
silver inkstand by rubbing them with
a paste made of water and a little
chloride of lime.

Table cloths, napkins, etc., should be
examined before washing, and thin
places repaired. It is a good plan
when preparing new linen for hem-
ming to save the threads that are
drawn out, and wind them on a reel
for future mending.
