Geese Gave Clues

The account published recently of a Syrian goose, in the gizzard of which were found flakes of pure gold, calls to mind a similar case which occurred some years ago in British

A wild goose shot at Pitt Lake was brought into New Westminister by the sportsman who had killed it, and when cleaned no less than 70 shillings worth of coarse gold was found in its

Prespectors started immediately for Pitt Lake, but, although alluvial gold was found, the quantity was not sufficient to enable anyone to make a for-

There are several other cases on ecord of gold being found in the bodies of birds. A duck killed on the farm of a man named Prebyl, who wned land near Omaha, in the state of Nebraska, was found to have several tiny nuggets of pure gold in its crop. These came from a stream running through the farm, but here as at Pitt Lake—the quantity of the precious metal was too small to make mining worth while.

He had a terrier with him, and the dog, scratching at a hole, exposed a mass of rock which the boy, who had been brought up in gold-bearing country, recognized at once as gold ore. He hurried home with his news, and his father lost no time in pegging out a claim. The ore proved very rich, the first parcel of 50 tons yielding three TRY IT ONCE YOU WILL ounces of gold to the ton.—Tit-Bits.
