INSULIN LABORATORY AT TORONTO UNIVERSITY AND ITS DISTRIBUTION.

TORONTO, Nov. 23 (Can. Press). Tucked away in an obscure corner of the University of Toronto grounds overshadowed by the new Electrical Engineering building and flanked by a row of venerable elm trees stands a two-story, red brick building formerly occupied by the University Y.M.C.A. A year or two ago it was planned to remove the building as it was not suitable for any University purpose.

Motor Show Boom Beats all Records

CONTRACTS MADE FOR SEVERAL MILLION POUNDS — 1924 OUTPUT SOLD.

At the rate of half-a-crown each, 21,389 people paid £3,923 12s. 6d. to visit the motor show at Olympia on Saturday.

A large percentage of them had travelled long distances by train during the previous night in order to be present when the doors opened.

'Thousands of people who are engaged in the motor industry came by special trains. Much difficulty was experienced in

finding sleeping accommodation, and in the neighbourhood of Olympia surprising sums were being obtained for even a "shakedown."

Although the show has been open only two days, remarkable business has been transacted.

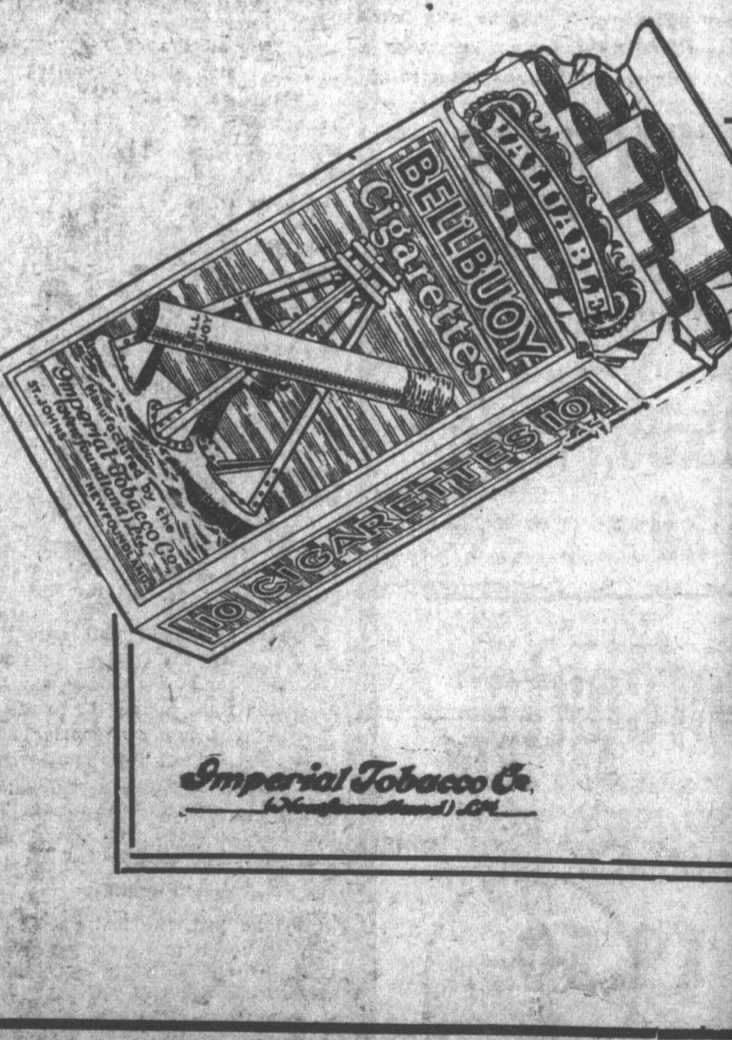
Petrol, oil and tyre prices are down to pre-war figures, or below, while it is generally acknowledged that car prices have touched "rock bottom."
