Grants from the Road Fund amounting to £300,000 have been made by the Ministry of Transport towards rural road schemes, and agreement has been reached with the Treasury for the expenditure next year of £750,000 in addition to the amount already devoted to this pur-

Every authority essentially rural will be entitled to a grant, which will be made up to 50 per cent. of the money expended in the case of definite improvements, such as strengthening and reconstructing.
