Londoners Win

In the Cricket Match With the Chicago Wanderers.

Many Entries Made for the Meteors' Meet.

CRICKET.

LONDON DEFEATS CHICAGO.

An eleven, playing under the colors of the Wanderers' Cricket Club, of Chicago, suffered defeat at the hands of the London Club yesterday on the Asylum grounds. Capt. Hyman, winning the toss, sent the Perkolopis team to the field, and with Walker faced the bowling of Cummings and Henderson. Cummings, who bowls very fast, took four wickets for nine runs before he had been trundling an hour, and the first five wickets went down for 35 runs, Terry being the only one of the half dozen batsmen to obtain double figures. Patterson and Becker making short stand and playing carefully for their runs, and the inning closed for a total of 92. Chicago then went to bat and were all retired before lunch for 84. J. Dairs contributed 31 in nice style. Henderson and Phillips were the only others to make double figures.

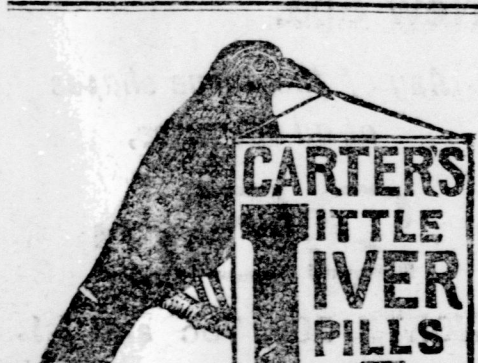
An hour was then devoted to a pleasant lunch under the trees, and at 3 o'clock London went again to bat. Terry and Walker soon got together and made things lively for the fielders by putting on 104 runs before Terry succumbed to a slow one of Fraser's. He put together 69 runs in his characteristic style in an hour and five minutes, and made 12 fours. Walker, who was the feature of the day, his wise play and driving being as near perfection as ever seen on the grounds. His score of 90 included 17 fours, 2 doubles, 1 triple and 15 singles. Local cricketers regret that this gentleman's name does not appear on the list of the international eleven, as he certainly deserves a place. Patterson again scored and batted in good form for his 52. The well meeting with some hard luck failed to wax as usually does, and the tenth wicket fell for the respectable score of 234, made in two hours and ten minutes, leaving Chicago with 243 runs to win and only a little over an hour to make them. However, they succeeded in making 74 of them for the loss of three wickets, the veteran Phillips and J. Davis being the chief scorers. They both showed excellent form for their runs and were not out when time was up. London thus won on the last inning. The fielding of the Londoners was very sharp and clean, every chance being accepted. The Chicagoans leave this morning for Hamilton, where they play today. The following is the score:
