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THE SHAH VISITS MAXIM WORKS

Shows Keen Interest in Latest Inventions—Fired Some Blank Cartridges.

London, Aug. 21.—The Shah paid a lengthy visit to the Maxim Works today. He showed keen interest in the latest inventions in artillery and electrical appliances. On the invitation of Sir Hiram Maxim, he got astride of the seat of a maxim gun and fired three belts of blank cartridges. His majesty was considerably shaken by the recoil at his first attempt, but he stuck to his post and finished like an experienced gunner. The Shah and his suite posed for moving pictures before leaving. He subsequently proceeded to the Persian legation, where he gave a state luncheon which cost \$15,000, so sumptuous were the decorations and arrangements.

Detroit, Aug. 21.—A. Torrey, chief engineer of the Michigan Central Railway, died last night at Harper Hospital as the result of injuries received on Tuesday afternoon near Albion, on the main line of the road.

Mr. Torrey, Bridge Superintendent and Chief Engineer of the Michigan Central Railway, was on a tour of inspection on a small gasoline car, when a rapidly running freight overtook them on a sharp curve. All three jumped. Mr. Torrey landed on a pile of rails alongside the track, and received the injuries which caused his death.

Mr. Torrey was 50 years of age and an expert in his line.
