ALLIES DECIDE GERMAN PACT Will Submit Mandate On Colonies to League of Nations. French Seek Protection Against Political Activity of Missionaries.

London, England, July 17.—An agreement has been reached by Great Britain, France and Belgium respecting the points in dispute in the various mandates for former German colonies.

It seems almost certain that an agreement will be reached on the class mandate and that they will be ready to sign the mandate.
