"The Navigator" Offers Five Reels of Mirth-Provoking Comedy.

The film is a refreshing breath for those who tire of society melodrama and those serious tales of the great open spaces.

Loew's have chosen a film program this week that is just about all laughs. Walter Heir's little one-reel skit, "Small Change," an Al Christie production, shows the fat boy to advantage. The scenic strips for the week include Lyman B. Jackson's "Studies of American Indians," some snapshots of naval activities and beauty spots in Hawaii, novel, amusing and educational. Earl Hurd's pen-pictures get increasingly funny with his "Hoboken Nightingale," a black and white study that is a tribute to the caricaturist.

Vaudeville Good.

Loew's vaudeville bill has quality this half. Jean Berrios, a wizard at female impersonation and dual voice work, appears in some flashy gowns, offers good singing and gets round after round of applause.

Murry Stutz and Octavia Bingham offer some sparkling eccentricities in their singing and talking act.

Obdalla and Adrienne has a dainty tumbling and acrobatic turn that has much merit and grace in its execution.

DUMBELLS REVUE RETURNS TO GRAND

"Ace High" Back For Another Engagement by Popular Demand.

The return engagement of Captain Plunkett's sixth annual revue, "Ace High," found the Grand theatre well filled last night. Those who had before been unable to see this latest production of the Dumbells company, were delighted with the new and attractive program.

The only disappointment was the failure of Ross Hamilton to appear in his inimitable role of "Marjorie." Worthy of "The Follies."

The story, adapted from Frank Adams' clever yarn, "Friend Wife," begins in a theatre where a beautiful Diving Venus and her chorus of bathing beauties put on an act with a trained seal that is worthy of the Follies. A timid little bridegroom, in the agonizing throes of his first quarrel with wife, who has run home to "mama," wanders in, seeking a moment's oblivion from his woes. That happens to be just the moment chosen by a sheriff to try to serve an attachment for Venus' trained seal, and Freddie, when he is impressed to assist a beauty in distress, puts in twenty-four hours of most ridiculously complicated adventures.

A spectacular flood adds thrills to the laughs, and there is romance besides for those who crave heart-interest.

Metal Diet Girl Now Recovering
