CONVENTION OF THE WOMEN'S INSTITUTE OF BONAVENTURE COUNTY HELD AT PORT DANIEL

Interesting Sessions Well Attended—Reports From Various Branches Show Much Activity and Good Work Accomplished—Life Membership Conferred—Other Particulars.

The Women's Institute of County Bonaventure met in annual convention at Port Daniel on July 2nd, with the President, Mrs. Cameron Dow in the chair.

Convention opened with the singing of the Ode, and the repetition of the Institute Creed.

The Institute Branches reported in order.

Cross Point—Mrs. Austin Quinn. There is a membership of 19. 12 regular and two special meetings were held. During the winter aid was rendered to needy families; a Christmas tree was provided for the children; thirty dollars in gold were given to the three schools in prizes; flowers were sent to the hospitals; fifteen dollars were given to a redemption home, and this will be continued two years longer; the boys' Hockey Club was helped towards a rink at Cross Point.

This Institute is well equipped with furniture, kitchen utensils, dishes, etc. New Richmond—Mrs. Wm. MacWhirter.

This Branch held regular monthly and several special meetings, there is a membership of 18.

Two bean suppers, one chicken supper, two social evenings and with the fees, the sum of \$603.83 was raised during the year. Cocos was supplied to two schools for the luncheon hour. Kitchen utensils were given to a family which had suffered by a disastrous fire. Other incidental expenses leave a balance on hand of \$31.10.

Each member has also tried to help the poor and needy in some way. Miss Poole gave a most interesting talk on Home Nursing and First Aid. She pointed out the necessity of a well-lighted, airy, well ventilated room, where cleanliness and gentleness on the part of the nurse was most necessary. She gave minute directions regarding ventilation, the bed and bed-coverings, the care and food of the patient.

Regarding first aid quick action was imperative while waiting for the doctor, she gave clear and definite instructions in cases of fainting, croup, severe nose-bleeding, burns, poisoning, hemorrhage, sprains and the making of the bed for a patient unable to be moved.

In the absence of the Secretary Treasurer, Mrs. Hughes of New Carlisle read the minutes of last convention and presented the report of the treasurer which showed a balance on hand of \$32.24.

The Nominating Committee was appointed, viz: Mrs. Wm. MacWhirter, Mrs. Austin Quinn and Miss Rena Caldwell.

Miss Poole's demonstrations on Thursday afternoon were very clear and interesting—consisting of preparing and stuffing a fish, and the preparation of a fish moid.

At the close of the session the delegates were entertained at a picnic-teea on the S. W. Point. This was most enjoyable, the beautiful situation, the blue waters of Port Daniel Harbor, the mountains beyond, the bluff and covered extending to Point Maqueron. Across the present shaped harbour is Harrington Cove, the scene of the wreck of the "Colbourne," one of the tragedies of this coast. To the right of the picnic ground is a little sequestered cove, known as Bab's Cove to which clings the flavor of old legend and buried money. Still farther to the rocky bluff and the lighthouse. The quiet beauty of the surroundings, the delightful hospitality of the people, and the opportunity afforded to renew old friendships or make new ones all added to the charm of the entertainment.


Mrs. Wm. A. MacPherson, President of the local Institute read the address of welcome:

We hesitated a little about asking the convention here, on account of not having a suitable building; however the school trustees came to our aid and gave us this school building, otherwise we should have had to use the building known as the "Lodge," which is rather out of repair, and not centrally located. We hope to have our new Community Hall ready for use in the near future. We have now seven hundred dollars in the bank for that purpose, and are preparing a letter with an objective of three hundred dollars which will enable us to purchase the amount we settled upon, to commence building operations. Our greatest need is a hall, and our work outside of this object is considerably handicapped. As any friend with a donate to a good cause, we will be glad to receive anything from a needle to an anchor, providing it is saleable. When our turn comes again we hope to entertain in our new hall, where you may see the results of your needle and anchor.
