Too Many Hotels.
At the meeting of the East York License At the meeting of the East York License commissioners a lengthy petition was presented by Rev. J. R. Johnston on behalf of a deputation composed of Reeve Stephenson and B. Morton of East Toronto. The petition stated that there are seven hotels licensed to sell intoxicating liquors in the immediate neighborhood of the village, while in the whole township over which the commissioners have jurisdiction there are only 10, four being practically within the bounds of East Toronto, viz., Empringham's, Hackett's, Bill's and Crew's; two but little removed, about a quarter of a mile from the boundary, Woodruf's and Bates', and one within a mile of the same, viz., Heber's or the Dutch Farm. That the first named four are for the most part where they are in order to take advantage of the close proximity of the citizens of East Toronto, and not for the accommodation or convenience of the municipality granting the license and receiving the fees, which is an injustice and wrong, and acting as a menace to the young men and a constant dread to children and ladies. That if East Toronto's boundaries were extended a very little four of those hotols would have to be removed. The petition also asked that the number of licenses be reduced to a number in accordance with reasonable requirements; and that the remaining licenses be located at points within the township not already provided. The rev. gentleman was patiently listened to, but the commissioners did not appear to be benefited much, as the old licenses were all granted.
