

McIntyre & Wardwell (John J. Dixon) received the following despatch to-day from Schwartz, Dupee & Co., Chicago: There was a wide range to wheat to-day, almost 5c, and it was not easily explicable. Up to noon the market, acted weak. In the last hour it was very strong. The fluctuations seemed to be ghiefly the result of pit operations, selling early, which overweighted the market, and then attempted later to cover. The statistical news was rather bullish, although on both sorts. The decrease in the visible was more than expected, 2,101,000 bu. There was a decrease on passage, 80,000 bush. The world's weekly shipments were 1,000,000 less than the week before. An estimate on the French crop made it 42,000,000 bu less than 1894. On the other hand, cables were weak; the Northwestern weather improved. Wheat shipments were large, 1,248,000 bu. There was an increase in the English visible of 350,000 bu. Seaboard clearances were small, less than 70,000 bu. There was no cash demand. As for crop news it was as conflicting as it has been for a week, claims of damags and counter claims. The president of St. Paul Railroad summarizes a detailed report from all their divisions up to mean that the crop generally will be good; that too, all owing to considerable damage in spots.

Corn opened steady, but did not hold. There was a very sudden break from 46 1-2c to 450, and only a partial recovery. There was not so good a cash demand. Phere was a fair decrease in the visible, 941,000 bu, and the expected large decrease in the local stock, 1,106,000 bu, but the talk of a possible squeeze has lessened the September trade. Some of the big shorts have covered. The other side of trade to-day was small. The receipts to-day were 190 cars; the estimates for Tuesday 150 cars.

Provisions fairly active and ruled lower; longs were selling out in pork and ribs, and there was some selling by packers. More trading was done in January deliveries, and packers would undoubtedly sell those deliveries
