number to the effect, "that they could not afford anything from heir funds;" others "have no money to spare, being engaged in erecting new Temperance Halls;" a number of new divisions have no funds as yet;" and some divisions "will guarantee collections at meetings where the G. D. agent may lecture.

In accordance with the instructions of the G. D., at the January Quarterly Session, a petition to the Legislature, from his body, praying for the enactment of a Prohibitory Liquor law, was duly prepared, and presented to the House of Assembly, on the 26th March, by A. W. McLellan, Esq. No action has yet, I believe, been taken on the petition.

Forty-three returns have been received from D. G. W. P's. I would suggest that they be referred to a special committee to appear thereon.

- 1. Correspondence from a number of the Subordinate Divisions, in answer to a circular from Central Division, No. 2, in reference to admission of colored persons into the Order.
