and poultry, as a fat producing element, it has no equal, and in the household economy we know how to appreciate it. The most common mode of culture is to plant in hills three to four feet apart; good results have been obtained where the drill system was applied. In either case it is now generally understood that it should not be hilled up as was the custom of former years. Further allusion as to the modes of production is not necessary; as practical farmers you are already familiar with these from experience. Therefore we suggest that you put your experience to the test, extend the area of your corn patch, and endeavour to improve the quality of the grain, selecting the largest, earliest, and most perfect ears for planting. You will please walk into that corn.
