

Votes of Thanks.

On motion of Dr. Waddell, seconded by Mr. Herdman, it was unanimously Resolved, "That the hearty thanks of the Synod be given to the Rev. The Rev. John McMillan was appointed to conduct devotional exercises tomorrow morning at 9.45 a. m., in the basement of St. Paul's Church, to which time and place the Synod adjourned to meet. Closed with praise and prayer.

FIFTH DIET.

In the Basement of St. Paul's Church, Montreal, P. Q., 15th June, 1875, which time and place the Synod of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland, met pursuant to adjournment, and after devotional exercises conducted by the Rev. John McMillan, was constituted with prayer by the Moderator, Rev. G. M. Grant.

The Roll having been called the minutes of yesterday's sederunt were read, and with some slight additions were sustained as correct.

The Report on Addresses having been called for, the Rev. J. Campbell, Convener, reported that the Committee recommended that all addresses be left to the United Church.

The Report of the Committee on arrangements for the consummation of Union and the final minute, which were read at Diet IV., were again submitted and adopted unanimously.

The hour appointed to proceed to Victoria Hall having arrived, the Moderator "linking on" to Rev. D. McRae, Convener of the Committee on Arrangements, &c., led in the procession to Victoria Hall, where it was arranged that the negotiating Synods should meet at 11 a. m., for the consummation of Union.
