

The Montreal Stock Yards company, report business at their yards for the week ended Dec. 30 as follows : Receipts, 426 cattle, 1,068 sheep, 159 hogs, 17 calves The cattle trade during the early part of the week was fair, but as the week advanced heavy receipts caused a declino in prices, closing with small lots left over. Small receipts of light hogs, with prices firmer than previous week, closing 10c higher. There was a larger receipt of lambs, which seemed to sell readily at fair prices. Good calves sell readily at large prices. We quote the following as being fair values : Cattle, butchers' choice.4 to 5c; do, medium, 3 to 34c; do, culls, 24 to 3c; lambs, 34 to 34c; calves, \$5 to 12; hogs, \$5.50.
