Order Paper Questions

2. (a) The proposed regulation, which will require the fitting of either containment tanks or treatment systems, will apply to new ships two years after the coming into force of the regulation and five years after that date for existing ships. However, ships will not necessarily be required to install containment tanks. (b) The two and five-year periods referred to above are to allow the industry time to order, manufacture and install the required containment or treatment systems.

3. (a) The proposed regulation referred to in the answer to Question 1 has been discussed with representatives of the Ontario Government and has been accepted in principle. (b) The province did not propose the two and fiveyear periods but has accepted these provisions in the proposed regulation.

4. On December 4, 1974, discussions were held between the federal and Ontario Ministers of the Environment. It was recognized that there are potential problems associated with either total containment or the use of flow through treatment devices on large ships. It was agreed, however, that the proposed Canadian regulations represent a significant advance in meeting obligations under the agreement. It was indicated that the Department of the Environment was generally satisfied with the proposed regulations and that the departmental officials would continue to work closely with officials from both the Province and the Ministry of Transport on this matter.
