ians, these children lack legal status in the country and, therefore, are not entitled to medical and educational services.

The hon. member need not be reminded that in Ontario, as in other provinces, medical and educational services remain under the jurisdiction of the province and are not made available to those lacking legal status. Notwithstanding this information, those parents who failed to consider their children's future health needs before bringing them to Canada illegally still have a course of action. The minister stresses that it is their responsibility, for the children's sake as well as their

own, to present themselves at a Canada immigration centre. Each case will then be dealt with individually and fairly, with full consideration of all compassionate and humanitarian aspects, especially when children are concerned.
