

The following Question on the Order Paper was passed by the House as an Order for Return, under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44, and an Order of the House was issued to the proper officer accordingly, viz:—

- By Mr. Murphy—1. Has Bob-Lo Island been sold or leased by the Government of Canada? If so, to whom has it been sold or leased, and when?
2. Who is the present owner or lessee?
 3. In the event of sale, what price?
 4. In the event of lease, what rent has been received to date by the Dominion Government?
 5. What were the conditions of any such sale or lease?

Pursuant to Special Order passed on Wednesday, April 27, 1949, the Order was read for the House to resolve itself again into Committee of Supply.

Mr. Abbott then moved,—That Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair.

And a Debate arising thereon;

By leave of the House, Mr. Cleaver, from the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce, presented the Second Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:—

Your Committee has considered Bill No. 244 (Letter A-4 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act respecting Guaranty Trust Company of Canada" and has agreed to report the said Bill without amendment.

The Debate on the motion that Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair for the House to resolve itself again into Committee of Supply, was then resumed.

And the Debate continuing;

By leave of the House Mr. Winkler moved,—That Bill No. 236 (Letter A-8 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act for the relief of Jessie Kathleen Batiste Latter", be now read the second time.

And the question being put on the said motion; it was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly read the second time and referred to the *Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills*.

By leave of the House Mr. Brown moved,—That Mr. Speaker do now leave the Chair for the House to resolve itself into Committee of the Whole on Bill No. 244 (Letter A-4 of the Senate), intituled: "An Act respecting Guaranty Trust Company of Canada"; which was agreed to.
