CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION OF CANADA

To the Honourable the Speaker of the Senate.

In accordance with the provision of Sections 12 and 61 of the Civil Service Act, the Civil Service Commission, at the request of the Clerk of the Senate, submits the following change in compensation for approval, effective from April 1, 1945:—

PARLIAMENTARY REPORTERS, SENATE

It is recommended that the compensation for this class which is at present—

Order-in-Council P.C. 64/3859 of May 30, 1945 authorized a change in the compensation for the class Parliamentary Reporter from \$2,640-3,480 to \$3,300-3,900, effective from July 1, 1944. The salaries of the Parliamentary Reporters and the Parliamentary Reporters, Senate have always been the same. It is, therefore, recommended that the compensation for Parliamentary Reporters, Senate be changed to \$3,330-3,900, the same as that authorized for the reporting staff of the House of Commons.
